

The Ottawa Mountain Bike Association (OMBA) is excited to announce that the Carlington Hill Bike Park is a go! Through the hard work of OMBA volunteers, support and feedback from community members, and the financial and logistical backing from the City of Ottawa, including River Ward councillor Riley Brockington, this project will be set to break ground in the late summer of 2019.

The bike park will be built to allow riders of all ages and level of experience to develop their technical mountain biking abilities in the skills development area, and apply these on the pump track. It is designed to be usable by absolute beginners, as well as having challenging components for the more experienced riders. Being established in central Ottawa (Carlington), it will be free and locally accessible to all community members. By establishing Ottawa's first outdoor bike park, it will reduce the number of informal bike trails occurring across Ottawa forests, and decrease the resulting environmental impact on these park areas.
